Dear Friends,

As I am writing this, Pastor Sandie and I are in the final days of the Advent season, preparing for Christmas. Soon, we will officially be in the Season of Christmas which, according to the Christian calendar, stretches for 12 days from Christmas Eve to January 6 (Day of Epiphany). During the "12 days of Christmas" we remember the miracle of God entering into humanity in the person of Jesus. Theologians call this "incarnation." Christmas is immediately followed by the season of Epiphany which stretches until Ash Wednesday (Feb. 14), which marks the beginning of Lent. Epiphany celebrates God's self-revelation to humankind, and we again hear the stories of the Wise Men, Simeon and Anna, and Christ's baptism.

As we move from Christmas to Epiphany the focus of our discipleship shifts, also. Just as Christmas celebrates "Christ with us" so Epiphany celebrates "Christ through us." Jesus Christ has come to us, and we strive to make Christ real for others.

Howard Thurman continues to be celebrated as a deeply faithful academic, theologian, author, mystic and poet. His poem "The Work of Christmas" marvelously explains the task of discipleship for Christ followers at this time of the year.



When the song of the angels is stilled, when the star in the sky is gone, when the kings and princes are home, when the shepherds are back with their flocks, the work of Christmas begins: to find the lost,

to heal the broken,

- to feed the hungry,
- to release the prisoner,
- to rebuild the nations,

to bring peace among the people,

to make music in the heart.

This holiday season, may the meaning and work of Christmas fill your heart, soul, and mind.

Reaffirmation of Baptism



Our worship theme on Sunday, January 7 is baptism, and we will again hear the story of Jesus' baptism in the Jordan River. As a way of commemorating this event, worshippers will be given the opportunity to be baptized or to re-affirm their baptism.

Baptism is the entry point into our spiritual journey. When we baptize infants both the family and the

congregation "choose Jesus" for a child with the understanding that the baptized child will take the vows of baptism for themselves later in life – perhaps at confirmation. Not only infants, but people of all ages are baptized as a sign of God's grace and a commitment to follow Jesus. In baptism, we are filled with the Holy Spirit, are given spiritual gifts for use in our journey with Christ, and are welcomed into Christ's universal church.

At different points in our spiritual lives, many people feel called to re-commit to their discipleship path with Jesus and it is not uncommon for folks to ask to be re-baptized. But remember, baptism is a gift of the Holy Spirit, and it is not necessary to be baptized again to re-commit to Jesus. The Holy Spirit has not taken the gift back even when we stray. Rather, we can re-affirm our baptism and again signal our desire to receive the blessings God is only too willing to shower upon us.

Now, to make this even more confusing, some people who grew up in a faith tradition that christened children rather than baptizing them may not know if they have been baptized or not. Baptism and christening, although the terms are often used interchangeably, are two very different things. Christening is essentially a naming ceremony while baptism invites the Holy Spirit into the one being baptized and signals their inclusion in the life of the universal church. If you are not sure if you have been baptized or christened, please talk to either of the pastors.

With all these things in mind, we will have a glorious celebration of Jan. 7 celebrating Christ's baptism and our own. If you or a family member would like to be baptized, or have any questions, please schedule a time to talk with the Pastors.


Caring Connections helps to care for the needs of our congregation. All are welcome to join us! Meetings are held in the Library at **9:00 AM on the first Wednesday every month**.

Kindergarten through 5th grade will meet in the 3rd Floor classroom. Youth in middle school will also meet for fellowship, activities, and study.




Exploring the Bible, led by Keith Henderson meets Sundays at 8:30 AM in the Builder's Room; all are welcome to join us!
