

Dear Friends,

John 12: 21-22 tells the story of a couple people who came to Philip, Jesus' disciple, and said 'Sir, we wish to see Jesus." Interestingly, the people asking Philip about Jesus were identified in the scripture as Greeks who had come to Jerusalem for the observance of Passover. Perhaps Philip was surprised that "outsiders" would be interested in meeting Jesus. But he was more interested in bringing people to Christ than worrying about cultural differences, so Philip told Jesus about the people.

Are there "outsiders" we can introduce to Jesus? Scholars who study religious identity in the United States have noted an interesting phenomenon. A significant (and increasing) number of people, when asked about their religious beliefs, indicate they are "spiritual, but not religious." I doubt anyone knows precisely what "spiritual, but not religious" means, but I think it describes folks who have a yearning for a deep connection with our infinite, mysterious, gracious God, but are not interested in what they fear they will find in the church: self-righteous, hard-hearted folks who are interested only in judging others.

And this leads me to two thoughts. First, the people of First UMC of Berthoud are not like those stereotypes. Pastor Sandi and I have found you to be delightful, dedicated, faithful disciples of Jesus. Well done. Our problem is in helping others find out about our Church.

And second, hard as it seems, our mission is to share Jesus with everyone. The question is how we share or witness. Often, we think witnessing (or its dread cousin,



evangelism) is about having all the answers and arguing people into the Kingdom of God. Knowing why your faith is real is important, but rarely will others find that, by itself, persuasive. Witnessing, and evangelism, is about relationships. First, having a personal life-changing relationship with Jesus Christ. And second, building deep, authentic relationships with others. When that happens, witnessing to your faith is nothing more than introducing one friend to another. What a blessing you can be.

Not everyone describes themselves as "spiritual, but not religious." There are people who know, or are coming to know, that Jesus is "the way, the truth, and the life" but for one reason or another have not found a worshipping community. They are like the people in John 1 who were seeking Jesus and when they asked where he lived, Jesus answered "Come and see." Are there people you know that might like to follow Jesus but need the invitation "come, and see?" Perhaps these are folks who are new to your neighborhood, people who have fallen away from church and want to come back, or those who have suffered a loss and are looking for love, grace and a community of support.

Christian artist, Steve Green writes "People need the Lord. At the end of broken dreams, He's the open door." Our privilege is to help others find the peace, joy, hope, grace and love we have found in a relationship with Jesus. One of the most significant ways to help others begin or grow in their spiritual journey with Jesus is to invite them to church with you. As we invite others to share in worship and to connect with the Berthoud UMC family it is as if we are responding to those first Jesus seekers by saying, "Come, and see."

Churches grow in size and vitality as its members embrace a "culture of invitation" in which people are consistently inviting others to join in worship, study, and ministry. These weeks leading up to Easter are a perfect time to begin inviting people to share worship with vou. I would invite you to pray about how you might share your heart and your faith with others who are seeking what you have found -Jesus.



Caring Connections helps to care for the needs of our congregation. All are welcome to join us! Meetings are held in the Library at **9:00 AM on the first Wednesday every month**.


