# From Pastors Mark and Sandie Johnson

Dear Friends,

Do you remember the line from that old movie "What we have here is a failure to communicate?" Sometimes our "failure to communicate" comes from hearing what another person is saying but not really listening to them. Do you know what I mean?

Several years ago, someone remarked to me, "You always came to church with wet hair." I felt so ashamed. But they were right, my hair was at least damp, if not dripping, by the time our family - all nine of us - got to church. You see, on Sunday mornings when all seven kids were at home, it was challenge for all of us to get ready. We had two bathrooms with one (tiny) water heater. Showers started with the youngest and proceeded to the oldest. There were more than one Sunday when Mark got the COLD shower. (Another story another time.) Needless to say, with all the rushing to get kids dressed, find shoes, comb hair (Mark was the worst) and so on, my hair was usually still wet when we all got to church.

Many years later we returned to that church where our kids grew up and Mark heard his call to ministry. As we were chatting with one of the Saints of the church, they said to me, "You always came to church with wet hair." For years I took this as a negative, it hurt. It

was just this week I heard it differently. Maybe I should say I listened to what they were saying without letting my guilt and shame get in the way. What I believe they



were really saying was "you always came to church, with at least seven kids, and you always CAME to church."

How often do we hear comments through the filters of our feelings and interpret them to be negative when actually they were meant as a compliment? For me, I've learned two lessons: be careful how I speak and be careful to really listen. And whether speaking or listening, let God's grace be in the conversation.

During November we will be celebrating our church's 150th anniversary and will have occasion to talk with folks that perhaps we haven't seen for a while. We might even meet some people who are brand new. Let us both speak and listen in ways that share the love of God in Jesus Christ.

### **150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary**

In the early 1870s, a group of settlers founded a colony, which they called Little Thompson, on the banks of the Little Thompson River south of present-day Berthoud. Shortly thereafter, Lewis Cross, one of the valley's first homesteaders, built a 12'X16', one-room log cabin, which served as the community's first church and school. In 1874 the United Brethren church established a mission in the log cabin, and this mission was the beginning of our church's ministry in the Berthoud area.



Following the decision to move the fledgling community, known as Berthoud by that time, to the town's present location, a church was built at the corner of  $4^{th}$  and Turner in 1886, followed by the construction of another, larger building at  $4^{th}$  and Mountain in 1905, and then the construction of our current church in 1957.

**Join us on November 24**th as we celebrate the 150th anniversary of the establishment of the United Brethren mission in Little Thompson. Bishop Kristin Stoneking will preach, as together we remember how God has blessed First UMC's ministry to the community and beyond. The service on the 24th will include congregational responses, scripture, and music that have been part of services for previous church milestones. Following the service, we hope to take a photo of all in attendance. Why not invite guests and former members to worship with us? After worship, we will enjoy our traditional Harvest Home Dinner and Auction. Tickets are \$10 for adults (13 and over), \$5 for kids (7-12), and 6 and under are free.

Every year, the members of our church family are invited to share their Discipleship Plan for 2025. A Discipleship Plan is an indication of how each of us intend to live the vows of church membership by supporting Christ's ministry in our church through our prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness. Essentially, this is an indication of our best intentions for the ways we will grow as disciples of Jesus Christ.

For the past several Sundays, church members have shared what the ministries of our church mean to them and their families. On October 27, we were all given the opportunity to complete our Discipleship Plan and bring it forward in worship to be consecrated. On October 27, we received 23 plans, totaling \$82,504 in financial support! Our goal is to receive 35 Discipleship Plans which would represent a 10% increase over last year.


# Weld County Ramblers - Sunday, November 17
